Polk Foundation Invests in Verland Information Technologies Infrastructure

It is with a grateful heart that Verland received a \$200,000 grant from the Polk Foundation as an investment in Verland's information technologies infrastructure.

Advancements in consumer electronics over the past twenty years have not greatly impacted the level of care and accessibility for individuals with moderate and profound disabilities. The end goal was to bring technological advancements in family communications, therapies, and support services for the individuals Verland serves. This was only possible by addressing the underlying aging networking infrastructure and supporting full platform adoptions.

Recently, Verland engaged with IDI Consulting to conduct a full IT assessment including business application functionality, infrastructure, network capacity, data integrity, phone systems, mobile devices, security, disaster recovery, laptops, and PCs. This grant from the Polk Foundation made it possible for Verland to address many of the highest priority items from that assessment.



Opening of Verland North

Our new Venango County campus, which opened in May, accommodates 25 individuals who previously resided at the former Polk State Center. Verland North will provide a place of comfort and familiarity to residents while we construct new Verland Signature Homes throughout Venango County.

Our Next Signature Home

With the support of the Edith L. Trees Charitable Trust, Verland will be able to build a new Verland Signature Home on Pear Orchard Road in Moon Township . The comfort and safety of residents are at the core of Verland Signature Homes.

Therapeutic Garden Funded

The Verland therapeutic and sensory garden on the Sewickley campus is the next step of a complete master plan for the Sewickley campus.

The completed garden will include a greenhouse, allowing individuals to start seeds indoors and enjoy horticulture therapies during cooler or dreary weather. Outside gardening spaces will include raised plant beds and accessible pods that will allow individuals with various core strength abilities to enjoy the garden.



The Rose Program at Verland

In 2022, in partnership with PCMA Palliative Care Division, Verland welcomed The Rose Program for Palliative Care.

This program provides an extra layer of medical support, enhancing the high-guality care already provided at Verland. We work closely with clients, families, and their healthcare team to decrease debilitating symptoms, improve outcomes, and restore quality of life. We have helped many clients and families navigate their illness and choices. The Rose Providers work with the current health care team and doctors to ensure we are providing care that is focused on your loved one's individual needs at Verland.





Features in the homes include fully accessible showers and baths, single-floor living, smart home technologies, oversized garages for adaptive vehicles, large fenced yards, and ceiling lifts throughout the home.
